

#### Gakushuin Women's College

Gakushuin Women's College (GWC) consists of the Faculty of International Studies and the Graduate School of International Cultural Relations. The Faculty of International Studies comprises three departments: the Department of Japanese Studies, the Department of Intercultural Communication and the Department of English Communication, featuring well-organized global educational programs, broad and in-depth liberal arts and interdisciplinary education, and the pursuit of traditional Japanese culture. The departments of Japanese Studies and Intercultural Communication offer special entrance examinations for international students. Programs at the Graduate School are designed to develop experts in international cultural relations through academic and practical research and education.

### History

Gakushuin is a time-honored, highly prestigious school. It has long been associated with the Japanese Imperial family. The present Emperor and many other Imperial family members have graduated from Gakushuin.

#### [Brief Chronological History]

1847 A study institute for children of the *kuge* (Imperial aristocracy) was established in Kyoto.

1877 The Peers' School (a school for members of the *kazoku* or the hereditary peerage of the Empire) named Gakushuin was established in Tokyo.

1885 The Peeresses' School, separate from Gakushuin, was established.

1906 The Peeresses' School was renamed to Gakushuin Girls' Division.

1918 Gakushuin Girls' Division was renamed to Gakushuin Girls' School.

1947 Gakushuin and Gakushuin Girls' School merged to create the Gakushuin Foundation.

1950 Gakushuin Women's Junior College Division was established.

1953 Renamed Gakushuin Women's Junior College.

1998 Gakushuin Women's College was established.



#### **Department Descriptions**

#### **◆Department of Japanese Studies**

The objective of the department is to help students improve their knowledge and understanding of Japanese culture, and develop abilities to communicate their knowledge globally.

The department offers curricula in the following four areas: art and thought, folklore and history, contemporary society, and comparative culture, which are designed to help students gain a rich understanding of the tradition and characteristics of Japanese culture.

#### ◆Department of Intercultural Communication

The aim of the department is to help students develop high communication skills and global awareness.

Emphasis is placed on the three areas of international relations, communication, and comparative culture and area studies. Programs for students in their third and fourth years are designed to help them acquire abilities to identify and analyze issues on their own through learning in seminars.



#### **◆Department of English Communication**

The objective of the department is to help students improve their practical English skills for use in global settings.

All second-year students participate in a six-month study abroad program at the University of Lethbridge, our partner university in Canada. In small classes, students can develop advanced English communication skills and learn about the international community and international relations. \*No special entrance examination for international students is available.





#### Seminars on Traditional Japanese Culture

Seminars on traditional Japanese culture, which are unique to GWC, are designed to help students gain a better understanding and knowledge of traditional Japanese culture through experiencing practical skills. Programs include not only Japanese calligraphy, flower arrangement and tea ceremony, but also other Japanese classical arts that even Japanese people rarely have opportunities to experience, such as incense appreciation and *yusoku-kojitsu* (traditional court rules of ceremony and etiquette).





#### f-campus Five-Campus Cross-Registration Program

This five-campus cross-registration program between Gakushuin Women's College, Gakushuin University, Japan Women's University, Rikkyo (St. Paul's) University and Waseda University is available to all students in their second or higher years. This credit transfer system applies to more than 2,000 courses.





#### Japanese Language

GWC offers Japanese language classes, which international students are recommended to take in their first year. (For the Japanese proficiency level required for admission to GWC, refer to the section of "Entrance Examinations.")



#### **Employment**

GWC students are highly regarded by companies, and their employment rate has been very high.




#### ◆Places of Employment by Industry (March 2017 graduates)

◆Job Search Support System Taking advantage of our small size, we provide students with refined support services\* tailored to their individual needs. \*Programs under the support system include job search seminars (seminars dedicated to international students are also available), individual job search counseling and company information sessions held at GWC.



#### **Partner Universities**

GWC has a partnership agreement with 22 universities\* in 15 countries, which provides GWC students with opportunities to study abroad.

Students studying at a partner university will be exempt from tuition fees (excluding some partner universities). Credits earned at such partner universities are recognized as credits earned at GWC, which allows students to complete GWC programs in four years. GWC also receives students from partner universities every year and has many international exchange programs.

Eligibility for applying for a tuition reduction:

- Privately financed international students with a student visa
- The amount of money sent from their home country (excluding the amount for admission fee, tuition, and other payments to the College) must not exceed 130,000 yen per month.
- iii. If the student is a dependent of a resident in Japan, the annual income of the supporter must not exceed 8,410,000 yen.

#### **Entrance Examinations**

#### **♦**Faculty of International Studies

A special entrance examination system for international students is available.

Applicants can either take the special entrance examination at GWC or use the EJU\* system.

#### \*Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU)

In addition to the special entrance examination for international students, which consists of English and Japanese language examinations and an interview, GWC screens applicants based on the results of the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU). Applicants can take the EJU in their home country without the need to visit Japan.

3) Eligibility for applicants / Females who meet all the following requirements:

(1) Hold a citizenship other than Japanese. Persons with Japanese citizenship are not eligible for enrollment application.

- (2) Are 18 years of age or over at the time of admission and have completed (or are expected to complete) educational programs outside of the Japanese education system for 12 years or more, or are recognized as having the equivalent by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology or GWC. Educational institutions which are located in Japan and managed under educational systems outside of Japanese systems are not applicable.
- (3) Have resident status stipulated in the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act, if residing in Japan.
- (4) Have passed the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (Level N1) provided by the Japan Educational Exchanges and Services, or have equivalent proficiency.
- (5) **EJU** If applying for enrollment by using the evaluation of the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU): Must have taken the subject tests for "Japan and the World" and "Japanese as a Foreign Language" of the EJU provided by the Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO), and must have had their results evaluated by July of the academic year before the enrollment. Evaluations made within two years before the enrollment application are valid.




